November 29, 1961 - August 13, 2025

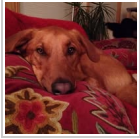

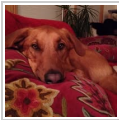
A gathering to share memories of Brian will be held at a later date.

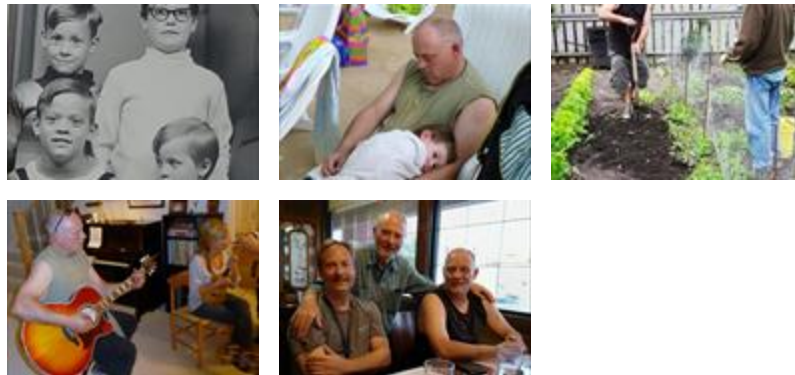

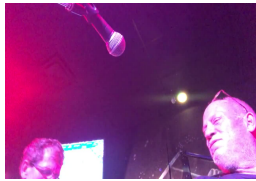

I always encouraged him to play music, and took him to West Edmonton Music Society to do open stage microphone, he absolutely loved it! after that Janet bought him a guitar, and he "lost" that, two years ago I found my very first guitar, and gave that to him in hope he would just embrace music. he lost that too some how..... . The message is, that the "music" will help in many ways , in these times of darkness. My rekindling of music on my last trip there with Shauna really really inspired me in all ways, in times like this where inspiration is hard to find. I was inspired by Brian's sense of humor heart and laughter, and his LOVE for music. and one song Brian loved is Fly like an Eagle by Steve Miller band

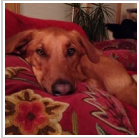
