It is with sadness that we announce the passing of Dung “Don” Manh Nguyen, a beloved son, brother, father, and ông ngoại (grandpa), who left us peacefully on December 1st, 2024. Born in Vietnam on February 21st, 1958, Dung's journey began when he moved to Canada in 1980 when he was 22 years old, eventually establishing a dry cleaner business in Prince George, BC, until moving to Edmonton, AB in 2003.

Dung was the proud father of two children, Thomas and Sandy. He delighted in the role of ông ngoại to his grandchildren, Mikey and Mila.

He is also survived by his nine siblings, Tien “Phuong”, Loan, Lien “Thuy”, Xuan, Thu, Hong, Ha, Chi & Quyen “Tho” as well as his mother Hanh. He is predeceased by his father Vien.

Following a severe stroke in 2021, Dung experienced global aphasia but always had a cheerful demeanor, frequently dancing and laughing.

He always loved the Edmonton Oilers and was often seen at the arena or local pub enjoying the game.

In honor of Dung’s life—a funeral service will be held at St. Joseph's Parish located at 1612 E 18th Ave., Vancouver BC V5N 2H6 on February 21st at 11

am—the day marking what would have been another year celebrating his birthday. His urn will be placed in its final resting place afterwards at the Gardens of Gethsemani Catholic Cemetery, located at 15694 32 Ave, Surrey, BC V3Z 9V1.
