Peter Hulnick was born in Smoky Lake Alberta, son of Maria Hulnick (Gordey) and Mike Hulnick. He was raised on a farm north of Andrew, Alberta and was the second youngest of nine children. At age 17, Peter moved to Edmonton, living with his older sisters and working as an apprentice bricklayer and then as a warehouse worker. He began taking night classes, completing his high school diploma while working full time. He continued to study, completing an Accounting designation. He married in 1953, and spent 66 happy years with his wife, Alice (Rock), raising a family, working at a career he loved, and spending time with his children and grandchildren.

Peter worked in various financial roles throughout a successful 40-year career with MacMillan Bloedel (later Weyerhaeuser) that took him across Canada to live in Winnipeg, Mississauga, Edmonton, Burnaby, White Rock, Langley, and then back to Edmonton. After retiring in 1991, Peter devoted himself to his home, camping, fishing, and golfing. For ten winter seasons, he and Alice drove south to Arizona, spending the months with friends and family. Over the retirement years, they also traveled the world, visiting Ireland, Florida, Las Vegas, Hawaii, Jamaica, and the Panama Canal.

Predeceased by Alice in 2019, Peter leaves two daughters, Gail (David); Laurie (Vern), six grandchildren, Brad; Andi (Cody); Sean (Jeanne); Steve (Brit); Christina (Sean) and Jacqui, five great grandchildren, Seby, Maven, Bella, William and Thomas, as well as many nieces and nephews, and his sister Ollie.
